Road steam is a recreational hobby maintained and funded by dedicated enthusiasts. It has an important role to play in living history, demonstrating the development of technology and how science & engineering has advanced in the last 200 years.

- 10 million visitors from all walks of life attend over 1200 steam events and museums each year.
- c.6000 road steam engines in the UK contribute just 0.0014% of the overall UK  $CO_2$  emissions.
- An estimated £745M is contributed through local businesses and charities to the economy each year.
- Whilst the overall CO<sub>2</sub> contribution made by the road steam movement is extremely small, the hobby recognises its desire to support initiatives which reduce or address CO<sub>2</sub>.

## This is being achieved through:-

- Assisting government legislation around the heritage sector.
- Lobbying and supporting efforts to protect the cleanest, most efficient steam coal supplies.
- Working with producers of manufactured fuels to seek cleaner and eco options in the future.
- Exploring meaningful carbon balancing initiatives.
